

Frequently Asked Questions

1. How do I know after the personal interview with the Nanny or she really fits in with my family?

The Nanny is always running a few hours with your family before you make a final choice. So you can see if the nanny also has a click with your children.

2. Can I apply for childcare allowance if I use child care at home?

You can apply for childcare allowance from the tax authorities. On the site of the tax you can apply for the supplement with your Digi-D code by email. Depending on your income, you get charged.

3. I have a Nanny. Can I register with you?

You can register with us along with your Nanny. It is important that the Nanny meets the requirements to continue registration in the National Register of Child Care. You can also apply for child care allowance.

4. What is a Risk Health and Safety Survey, and why do you take that off at my house?

With the RI & E VG we will check the following:

- What risks does the care of children bring with them;
- what precautions you have taken to prevent damage to the health of children;
- whether further measures are necessary.

We put this in writing in a plan of action for safety and health. In it, we mention what measures you will take and what the outcomes are of these measures. We discuss with you and the Nanny the completed form, and then you sign it. This document will be sent upon registration in the National Register of Child Care.

5. Has the Nanny holiday entitlement?

The Nanny has under the 'dienstverlening aan huis' service right to four weeks paid vacation a year. They take them in consultation with you.

6. What's the role of Nannywereld after a Nanny has started in our family?

The advisor is your contact. She meets with you twice a year to evaluate past cooperation. Of course you can always call her if you want to discuss something. You can also consult the pedagogue of Nannywereld for questions concerning the education of your children. Nannywereld ensures that your nanny will be regularly informed of the developments in the workfield. We do this through meetings and training sessions.
